| Barrington | Did not respond |
| Bristol-Warren | Reduced February vacation to Monday & Tuesday only. Moving April to March after surveying parents and school staff |
| Burrillville | Reduced February vacation to Monday & Tuesday only |
| Central Falls | We've maintained the same vacations for the last few years. One week in February and one week in April. We've worked with our teachers, families and administrators to gauge the preference and all are in agreement with our current vacation schedule. But, we're keeping the conversation open and are looking at the trends across the state. We will review and monitor moving forward. |
| Chariho | The School Committee has set up a subcommittee to study the issue. Recommendations are expected. |
| Coventry | Coventry Public Schools has decided to continue with both the February and April vacations. There was a plan to eliminate or shorten February vacation. It appeared at one point that all districts were entertaining moving towards this plan. After surveying surrounding communities who send students to Coventry's Regional Career and Technical Education Center, it was determined that most of those communities had preserved February and April vacations. |
| Cranston | We still have a full vacation week in both months. Any future changes would be made based on results of family and staff surveys. We do these every couple of years. Our last surveys indicated that families and staff did not favor any changes to our calendar. The last survey was done in 2015. |
| Cumberland | We have not had a February vacation for a few years now. We do have a professional development day planned for the day after the President's Day holiday. April vacation remains in place. We did consider adding a March and eliminating the April vacation. The School Committee decided to stay with the April vacation for the 2017-2018 school year. The School Committee was given two options for the 2017-2018 school year. One had the March vacation week and the other continued with the April vacation. The committee decided to stay with the April vacation. |
| East Greenwich | No changes to February or April vacation. Not sure if there will be any changes in the future. The School Committee voted to leave the schedule as is on 4/28/15. The East Greenwich School Committee charged an Ad Hoc Committee (2014) to determine the feasibility of making changes to the academic calendar. The Ad Hoc Subcommittee reviewed the current academic calendar and provided recommendations to the School Committee to consider for strategic planning purposes. <i>Recommendations: We recommend that effective school calendar year 2015-2016, the President's Day holiday be taken as a long weekend instead of a full week off from school. The past few years' disruptions in the school calendar due to inclement weather around this time period combined with survey data support this shift.</i> <i>We also recommend that East Greenwich reconsider the timing of its Spring vacation.</i> |

| | <i>Traditionally, Rhode Island has tied its Spring vacation to Patriots' Day, a Massachusetts State Holiday. We believe that East Greenwich would be better off tying Spring Break to the Good Friday/Easter/Passover week when possible. In addition to gaining 1 day of traction by incorporating Good Friday into Spring Break, this time period is usually 12 weeks earlier than the current Spring Break, which would create more even spacing for a full week holiday between the Christmas break and the end of school. We recommend that the school committee take a lead role in working with other Rhode Island school districts to select a Spring Break that makes more sense for Rhode Island families.</i> |
| East Providence | We did not change February or April vacation. There was no interest in East Providence. |
| Exeter-West Greenwich | Exeter-West Greenwich has maintained both vacations. Because we send students to Career and Technical schools (Chariho and Coventry), we try to mirror their schedules to the extent possible. Both Coventry and Chariho have kept February and April vacations, so we have done the same. |
| Foster-Glocester | Three years ago we modified February vacation week. We now have school on Wednesday-Friday of that week. No change to April Vacation. |
| Jamestown | We provide an abbreviated February Break with 2 days off and the traditional April Vacation. This will be the same vacation schedule for the 2017-2018 school year. These schedules were created with input from our families. |
| Johnston | Johnston has not reduced or changed either February or April vacation. We currently don't have plans to adjust either vacation. |
| Lincoln | Yes, we have reduced February vacation. We celebrate President's Day on Monday and on Tuesday we have a professional development day for staff. Students attend school Wednesday through Friday. This was the first year Lincoln followed this schedule. |
| Little Compton | Little Compton hasn't made any changes, we follow Portsmouth's schedule because our kids attend Portsmouth High School. We haven't any discussions regarding altering school vacation. |
| Middletown | No changes to February or April vacation, there hasn't been a big push to change. We'll send out a survey for the 18-19 school year to parents and staff. |
| Narragansett | Narragansett hasn't made any changes to the February or April school vacations, they remain at one full week for 2017 and for 2018. |
| Newport | Did not respond |
| New Shoreham | Did not respond |
| North Kingstown | NK has a 4 day weekend in February and a week off in April. We surveyed the community and found their preference to be have it this way. There is an interest in coordinating our vacation times with all of our neighboring districts. |
| North Providence | Two years ago, North Providence reduced February vacation to Presidents' Day and the Tuesday after in order to accommodate make up days due to snow cancellations. April remains the same - one week. No plans at this time to combine February and April |

| North Smithfield | No changes to February or April vacation. No plans to make any changes, unless RIDE adopts a statewide calendar. |
| Pawtucket | No changes to February or April vacation, but we may survey again to see if there is a change in opinion from the original survey. The reason we didn't make changes was because our surveys to staff and families did not support the change. When we looked at the surrounding communities last day of school, we were at the same day for release or one day later in June. |
| Portsmouth | We surveyed parents and staff in the Fall of 2016 with questions about the calendar. These questions included the options of reducing or eliminating the vacations. We did not receive overwhelming support for either reducing or changing/eliminating vacations. So for now the school vacations will remain as is in February and April. We will wait a couple of years and then survey everyone again. |
| Providence | We did truncate our February vacation several years ago, so it is two days vs. five days long. This change was in response to a recommendation made by the RI School Superintendent's Association that school districts consider abolishing February vacation and replacing it with a long weekend. |
| Scituate | No changes to February or April vacation and no plans to do so in the near future. We did a survey of our parents a few years ago. The results did not speak strongly one way or the other about changing vacation times. |
| Smithfield | Did not respond |
| South Kingstown | No changes to February or April vacation We have surveyed our school community and the results have not prompted us to change the current school calendar. |
| Tiverton | February Break has been reduced from five days to two days. April Break remains unchanged (one week). |
| Warwick | The Warwick School Committee voted last February 2016 to shorten the 2018 February vacation. This past February 2017 the School Committee looked at different options for the 2018 April vacation but voted to keep it as is. |
| West Warwick | Did not respond |
| Westerly | This year our February break was two days - Monday and Tuesday. There was no change to April vacation, it remained one full week. The School Committee, after surveying the community, decided to reduce the February vacation to be proactive around making up potential snow days. The decision is also influenced by the commitment to start school after Labor Day. |
| Woonsocket | Woonsocket will not make any changes to its district calendar next year. We will maintain our February and April vacations. |
